

Holiday RECIPE

Dinner parties, family gatherings, and extra time at home. All great reasons for you to try my favorite Christmas recipe.

What You Need:

- 6 cups water
- 1 cups uncooked quick cooking grits (not instant)
- 2 cups shredded cheddar cheese (divided)
- 1/4 cup butter, cut into pieces (divided)
- 1 pound ground pork or turkey breakfast sausage
- 6 large eggs
- 11/2 cups milk
- salt and pepper to taste



Eausage Latits Souffle

How To Make:

- O1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Lightly grease a large baking dish.
- O2. Cook sausage in a skillet over mediumhigh heat until browned and crumbly, 5 to 7 minutes. Drain.
- O3. Cook grits according to package directions. Mix in 11/2 cup cheddar cheese and butter. Stir until melted. Season with salt and pepper to taste.
- O4. Beat eggs and stir together with milk. Slowly stir in the egg mixture, then add the sausage.
- O5. Transfer to lightly greased 9"x13" pan.
 (Can be refrigerated up to 2 days at this point.) Bake preheated oven for 1 hour until puffed/set/golden. Sprinkle with remaining cheese and bake 2 min. more.
