If you just can't get in the spirit (or if you just can't get enough of it!) get yourself to Miracle on Cary. The holiday season transforms <u>The Jasper</u> to the most over-the-top celebration of Christmas you've ever seen. Make a reservation with friends for eggnog or another festive cocktail, and soak up the cheer! Open throughout December.

#### HOME FOR THE HOLIDAYS

My biggest entertaining trick? Always have something on hand to take or host at home. A great way to always be ready - keep a small wheel of brie on hand during the season, along with a jar of chunky, red berry or cherry jam. Place the brie on parchment and bake at 350 for 10-12 min, top with jam, and heat for 3-5 min more. Use parchment to lift to the plate, and serve with crackers. So easy, and always a wow that gets devoured!

#### HAPPINESS IS BAKERY-MADE

There are so many fantastic bakeries in Richmond and the surrounding area, it's really hard to pick a favorite. So, I won't. It wouldn't be the holidays without sweet treats, and some of the best come from <a href="Shyndigz">Shyndigz</a> on Cary, <a href="Idle Hands Bread Co">Idle Hands Bread Co</a> on Strawberry St., and <a href="Whisk">Whisk</a> on Staples Mill Road. #### HOST AND HOSTESS

My hands down favorite gift to have "on hand" is a cheeseboard crafted from reclaimed slate and wood (from Richmond area homes) handmade at and sold by <u>Governor's Architectural Antiques</u> in Mechanicsville.





Not to brag, but these really are the best. They're great for gifting, with other treats, or solo. They're great with tea, or coffee, and they've got more zip than store-bought. Try them and you'll be making them every year!

# What You Need:

- 11/2 cups butter, softened
- 2 cups sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 cup molasses
- 4 1/2 cups all purpose flour
- 3 teaspoons baking powder
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1 teaspoon ground cloves
- 1e teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- Additional sugar for rolling





# How To Make:

- 1. In a mixing bowl, cream butter and sugar.
- 2. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition.
- 3. Beat in molasses.
- 4. Combine the flour, baking soda, cinnamon, ginger, cloves, salt, and nutmeg; gradually add to creamed mixture. Refrigerate for at least 1 hour, or until dough is easy to handle.
- 5. Roll into 1 in balls; roll in sugar.
- 6. Place 2 inches apart on ungreased baking sheets and press slightly flat with a glass.
- 7. Bake at 350 for 8–12 minutes, or until puffy and lightly browned.
- 8. Cool for 1 minute before removing to wire racks to

I wish I could tell you how many this makes, but I forgot, and I haven't made them yet this season! I can tell you that you should have enough for eating and gifting. They're delicious!
